<p>1</p>	<p><b>ASTER</b> China Aster Blend</p>	 <p>© Botanical Interests, Inc.</p>	<p><b>When to Sow:</b> 1 to 2 weeks after your average last frost date, when soil temperature is at least 65°F. Mild Climates: Sow in late summer for winter bloom.</p> <p><b>Hardiness:</b> Annual</p> <p><b>Exposure:</b> Full sun to part shade</p>
<p>2</p>	<p><b>CHAMOMILE</b> ROMAN</p>		<p><b>When to Sow:</b> (Indoor) Start seeds 4-6 weeks before your last frost date to get a head start. (Outdoor) After all danger of frost has passed in spring, or in late fall</p> <p><b>Hardiness:</b> Very hardy, tolerating temperatures down to -30°F (-34°C).</p> <p><b>Exposure:</b> Full sun to part shade</p>
<p>3</p>	<p><b>CONEFLOWER</b> Dwarf Red</p>		<p><b>When to Sow:</b> Sow outdoors after a killing frost.</p> <p><b>Hardiness:</b> Generally hardy in Zones 4-9.</p> <p><b>Exposure:</b> Full sun</p>
<p>4</p>	<p><b>COREOPSIS</b> (Dwarf lancee - leaved)</p>		<p><b>When to Sow:</b> Start seeds 6-8 weeks before your last spring frost for transplanting out later.</p> <p><b>Hardiness:</b> Generally hardy in zones 4 through 10</p> <p><b>Exposure:</b> Full sun</p>

<p>5</p>	<p><b>COSMOS</b> Candy Stripe</p>		<p><b>When to Sow:</b> 1-2 weeks after your last expected spring frost, once soil temperatures are consistently above 60°F  <b>Hardiness:</b> Protect from frost (below 32°F/0°C); they are not truly "hardy" in winter.  <b>Exposure:</b> Full sun</p>
<p>6</p>	<p><b>COSMOS</b> Rubenza</p>		<p><b>When to Sow:</b> After the last frost, when soil temperatures consistently reach 60-70°F  <b>Hardiness:</b> Cosmos are warm-season annuals  <b>Exposure:</b> Full sun</p>
<p>7</p>	<p><b>FLOWER MIX</b> Bring Home the Butterflies</p>		<p><b>When to Sow:</b> Mild Climates: Fall through early spring.  <b>Hardiness:</b> Annuals, perennials, and biennials  <b>Exposure:</b> Full sun</p>
<p>8</p>	<p><b>FOUR O'CLOCK</b> Color Blast</p>		<p><b>When to Sow:</b> Plant after all danger of frost has passed, when soil is warm (around 65°F).  <b>Hardiness:</b> Perennial in Zones 9-11; grown as an annual in Zones 2-8.  <b>Exposure:</b> Full sun</p>

<p>9</p>	<p><b>GAILLARDIA</b> Blanket Flower</p>		<p><b>When to Sow:</b> Spring after the last frost, or in fall in warmer climates (Zones 9-10) <b>Hardiness:</b> Hardy from USDA Zones 3 to 10 <b>Exposure:</b> Full sun</p>
<p>10</p>	<p><b>HOLLYHOCK</b> Indian Spring Mix</p>		<p><b>When to Sow:</b> 1-2 weeks after your average last frost date, or about a week before the last frost. <b>Hardiness:</b> Hardy in USDA Zones 3-9, tolerating a wide range of temperatures. <b>Exposure:</b> Full sun</p>
<p>11</p>	<p><b>KALE</b> Mixed Ornamental</p>		<p><b>When to Sow:</b> 1-2 weeks after your average last frost date, or about a week before the last frost. <b>Hardiness:</b> Extremely hardy; most varieties withstand temperatures down to 18°F <b>Exposure:</b> Full sun</p>
<p>12</p>	<p><b>LUPINE</b> Arroyo</p>		<p><b>When to Sow:</b> Fall/Winter (Best): Direct sow in late fall or early winter, allowing natural cold stratification for spring germination and blooms. <b>Hardiness:</b> tolerating temperatures down to 20°F (-6°C). <b>Exposure:</b> Full sun to partial shade</p>

<p>13</p>	<p><b>MILKWEED</b> Butterfly Flower</p>		<p><b>When to Sow :</b> 2 to 4 weeks before your average last frost date, or in the fall for spring germination. <b>Hardiness:</b> Perennial in USDA zones 3 and warmer <b>Exposure:</b> Full sun</p>
<p>14</p>	<p><b>NETTLELEAF HORSEMINT</b></p>		<p><b>When to Sow :</b> Direct sow in fall, pressing seeds lightly onto so,they'll germinate the next spring after winter's cold. <b>Hardiness:</b> Good tolerance to cold. <b>Exposure:</b> Prefers full sun but can handle partial shade.</p>
<p>15</p>	<p><b>POPPY</b> California Mix</p>	 <p>© Botanical Interests, Inc.</p>	<p><b>When to Sow:</b> 4 to 6 weeks before your average last frost date, when soil temperature is 50°–60°F, or early to mid-fall for bloom the following spring. <b>Hardiness:</b> Perennial in USDA zones 8–10; usually grown as an annual. <b>Exposure:</b> Full Sun</p>
<p>16</p>	<p><b>RED MILKWEED</b></p>		<p><b>When to Sow :</b> 2 to 4 weeks before your average last frost date, or in the fall for spring germination. <b>Hardiness:</b> Perennial in USDA zones 3 and warmer <b>Exposure:</b> Full sun</p>

<p>17</p>	<p><b>STRAWFLOWER</b> Swiss Gaints Blend</p>		<p><b>When to Sow:</b> 6-8 weeks before your average last frost date <b>Hardiness:</b> Thrives in warm climates <b>Exposure:</b> Full sun</p>
<p>18</p>	<p><b>SUNFLOWER</b> Autumn Beauty (Organic)</p>		<p><b>When to Sow:</b> 1 to 2 weeks after your average last frost date. <b>Hardiness:</b> Annual <b>Exposure:</b> Full sun</p>
<p>19</p>	<p><b>SUNFLOWER</b> Goldy Double (Organic)</p>		<p><b>When to Sow:</b> Plant after all danger of frost has passed and soil temperatures are consistently around 60°F (15-18°C), typically late spring. <b>Hardiness:</b> Thriving in warm, sunny, and sheltered spots for strong, double golden blooms. Annual <b>Exposure:</b> Full sun</p>
<p>20</p>	<p><b>ZINNIA</b> Red Scarlet (Organic)</p>		<p><b>When to Sow:</b> Wait until all danger of frost has passed and soil temperatures are consistently above 60-70°F <b>Hardiness:</b> Very tender and sensitive to cold; plant them out only when it's truly warm. <b>Exposure:</b> Full sun</p>

<p>21</p>	<p><b>ZINNIA</b> Coral Beauty</p>		<p><b>When to Sow:</b> Late spring, after all danger of frost has passed and soil temperatures are consistently above 70°F  <b>Hardiness:</b> Heat-loving and dislike cold  <b>Exposure:</b> Full sun</p>
<p>22</p>	<p><b>ZINNIA</b> Envy</p>		<p><b>When to Sow:</b> 4-6 weeks before your average last frost date  <b>Hardiness:</b> handling heat but not frost.  <b>Exposure:</b> Full sun</p>
